

Executive Director's News Haidong Liang, Ph. D.

I would like to share some exciting data regarding our membership growth. As of September 24, the number of our Centre's membership has surpassed the 2,000 mark, making us one of the largest senior centres in Alberta! Since January 1, 2017 (when our Centre started the marketing campaign), WSAC recorded **1,381 new members** who have joined our WeSeniors family.

On the other hand, this growth also has posed a huge challenge to our administrative team, especially when we only have the resources to add one new part-time staff to the team this year. In order to better serve you, I decided to implement the following Morning Front Door Opening Procedure:

Morning Front Door Opening Procedure

- 1) **The Front Door will not be opened until 8:30 am**. However, certain members (e.g., members who are taking DATs) may arrive earlier than 8:30 am. In this case, we will let them in to wait in the front lobby area. During the Winter Season, we will **NEVER** leave any seniors waiting outside of the Front Door.
- 2) At 8:30 am the Front Door will be unlocked. However, the reception sliding gate and the hallway sliding gate will not be unlocked until 8:45 am. The front lobby, the Harry Farmer Room, main washrooms, the Community Cafe, the Gym and the Kitchen will be opened to instructors, volunteers, and members.

This change is because our members' safety is our top priority. Due to the size of the building, there are numerous areas (e.g. fitness room, workshop, the independent washrooms) where someone could fall or get hurt and staff would not know. As I mentioned, we have limited staff and we are all busy setting up the Centre for the day. Also, just a friendly reminder that the rules for utilizing the fitness room, workshop and craft room require more than one person present at the same time.

Thank you for your understanding and cooperation!



TOONIE TALKS


We recently had a question at our Coffee Conversation with a member regarding the cancellation of some of our Toonie Talks earlier this month. The member wanted to know why the Toonie Talk was cancelled.

Toonie Talks are hosted by our Friends of WSAC business community connectors. We need a minimum of 5 attendees to warrant the businesses coming to our centre to do their presentation. Unfortunately, earlier this month we had 2 Toonie Talks that had under 3 people registered. We contacted the business the morning of the presentation to let them know we were cancelling the presentation due to low enrolment and asked them if they would like to reschedule to a later date. We then called the people who signed up to let them know that the presentation had been cancelled. Later that day, 7 people came to the centre 30 minutes before the presentation was to begin wanting to register. We had to tell them the Toonie Talk had been cancelled.

Needless to say, both the members and the businesses were disappointed - for the members, they had come to the centre to see the presentation; for the businesses, that had spent time doing everything necessary to do a presentation, only to be told it was cancelled.

The good news...one of those businesses, Oliver Denture will be returning to our centre in November! 5th to do their presentation "What to Expect From Dentures."

PROGRAM NEWS



We have received many questions over the last several months as to why we have cut off dates for ticket sales for Special Events and Travel trips as well as why we ask you to sign up ahead of time for Toonie Talks.

For our Special Events and Travel Trips - we have volunteer committees for both of these and they work very hard to put together entertainment, food, decorations etc. for special events and transportation, admission etc. for trips.

Many of these things need to be booked or purchased ahead of time and sometimes require deposits and cancellations by a certain date. By having cut off dates, we have time to ensure we have sold enough tickets to run the event on a cost recovery basis and it gives us time to make final arrangements and complete purchases. We do not usually sell tickets at the door for events as we have already planned on a certain number for food, prizes etc.

For our Toonie Talks, we ask you to sign up ahead of time so that we can ensure we have enough people coming to make it worthwhile to hold the talk. We wouldn't want to have a presenter make the time to come to our centre and present and not have anyone come. It also makes it easier for the presenter to bring enough hand-outs for the people attending.

All of these events, trips and Toonie Talks are typically advertised at least 2 months in advance to give our members lots of time to purchase their tickets. So, make sure you get your tickets early to avoid disappointment. We have lots of great things happening and love to have as many people as possible able to enjoy them.

HISTORY OF CROKINOLE

Did you know Crokinole was invented in the late 19th century in southern Ontario?



The first crokinole board was built by Eckhardt Wettlaufer in 1876 in Sebastopol, Ontario. Wettlaufer was a woodworker and wagon-maker who made the board as a birthday gift for his son.

The relic currently hangs in the Joseph Schneider Haus Museum in Kitchener, ON. It is unclear where Wettlaufer got the idea from the game, but it's likely that it is derived from the Asian game of carroms by way of British colonists.

Carroms is also the ancestor, purportedly, of pocket pool, knips-brat, and pichenotte (associated with Quebec). The name "crokinole" is derived from the French 'croquignole' which means 'flick' or 'small biscuit'.

Before long, the game caught on and was being distributed commercially by mail-order giants such as Sears-Roebuck and Montgomery Ward and Co.. Crokinole soon became one of the most popular games in North America. It was very popular, in particular, with Mennonite and Amish groups, as the game had none of the shady associations of billiards or card-playing. The Montgomery Ward Catalogue refers to this squeaky-clean image when it describes crokinole as "a new and intensely interesting game for everybody, with *no objectionable features*."

FUNDRAISING NEWS









NUTRITION

In the September Observer, we introduce the DASH diet to you, where we outlined how it can help you lower blood pressure.

However, did you know not only can the DASH diet decrease the blood pressure but it can also help to reduce the risk of dementia?

This month, we want to share some information about your diet and dementia with you.

According to Public Health Agency of Canada statistics in 2015, 19% of seniors above the age of 80 had dementia.

While dementia is not an inevitable part of aging, the World Health Organization has outlined some of the things we can do to help prevent dementia:


- physical activity,
- avoid smoking,
- eat a healthy balanced diet,
- reduce or quit harmful alcohol use,
- maintain a healthy weight and management of diabetes, high blood pressure, and unhealthy cholesterol levels.

Recent studies show that diet patterns like the Mediterranean, DASH and MIND diets have a role in protecting us against dementia.

Outlined is the difference between the DASH diet and the Mediterranean diet.

The Mediterranean diet comes from its namesake and is a traditional diet for that area of the world.

Many health professional recognize these 2 diets as a way to avoid a number of health issues.



In the next month, we will talk to you about the MIND diet.

- 3. We investigate alleged breaches discreetly, and ensure our findings are evidence-based.
- 4. Everyone in the process including both the person with the complaint and the person with the complaint against them remains with confidential and protected for their privacy and dignity.
- 5. We will resolve the issue with an action plan.
- 6. Our hope is to achieve a greater understanding of our interconnectedness and how our behaviour affects others.
